

Shoal Creek

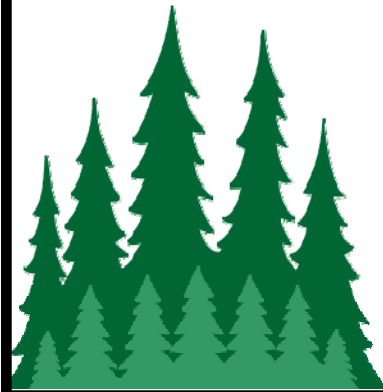

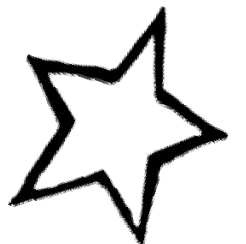

Registering For Camp

What To Bring?

For school age campers, select your camp by the grade you will enter in the fall. Complete the registration/health form and have it signed by your pastor. mail the form with a \$10 deposit to session director or as instructed for each camp. The remainder of the fee is due when you arrive at camp. REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS TWO WEEKS PRIOR to the FIRST DAY of your camp. Registration is made with the understanding that the camper will remain in the camp the entire period. Limited camper insurance is provided for persons in case of accident or illness while at camp. This insurance is secondary coverage, with the family's insurance as primary. If a camper has no insurance, the camp insurance is primary. Specific information regarding special activities, starting times, and other concerns is available from each Camp Session Director. Make as many copies of the registration form as you need.
